Statement of Principles

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All Persons shall be committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Rules and Regulations

General

1. Every class offered herein is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current rules of Equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC General Regulations Rule Book 2018 edition and in particular Section E Dressage 2018. Knowledge of the rules is the responsibility of the competitor. Please direct questions regarding rules and regulations to the stewards.
2. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.
3. All riders and competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protection headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on the competition or event grounds. Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British Standard, BSI, is also acceptable.
4. Any horse entered in any class at the competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. Drug testing fees are \$3.50 for Bronze-only competitors and \$7.00 for Gold competitors.
5. Neither Kelowna Riding Club nor any member of the show committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators, owners, trainers, riders or grooms.
6. Maximum number of tests per horse per day is four, regardless of the number of competitions entered, and horses may ride tests from two consecutive levels only.
7. Competition numbers must be worn by the horse or rider/handler anywhere outside the stall. The number must be visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. Failure to display the number may result in elimination or disqualification.
8. Schooling Passes for non-competition horses at \$35.00 at the show office. # will be provided and be visible when on KRC grounds outside of stable area. Schooling passes subject to EC rules and must accompany a HCBC #. (All other fees applicable, see entry form for details.)

9. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to present themselves to the Steward for tack check immediately following their ride. Failure to do so will incur elimination.
10. Failure to ride at the scheduled time will incur elimination. Times will be posted on the SHP Website: www.shproductions.ca and emailed to competitors and will be posted on the grounds at the club house by Wednesday evening, May 16, 2018. 11.
11. Test Callers are permitted as per Equestrian Canada/FEI rules and must be provided by the competitor.
12. Whips may be to a maximum length of 1.20m (1.00m for ponies) and are allowed at all levels in an EC Competition.
13. Lunge whips are permitted only when lunging.
14. Lunging is permitted in designated areas only.
15. Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times

License and Membership

All Competitors

16. Horse Council B.C. membership is mandatory for all competitors and horse owners on the Kelowna Riding Club grounds. A photocopy of the current HCBC membership card must be attached to all entry forms.

Gold Competitors

17. For all Gold Competitions, Owners and Riders must be current members of both the National (Gold) and Provincial Equestrian Federation of residence or pay the \$45.00 temporary sport license fee. All entries must include a photocopy of the owner's and rider's current 2018 EC and HCBC or AEF or USEF membership cards. Non-members must provide a completed temporary sport license form along with their payment. All Gold competition riders must complete payment of the Dressage Affiliate Fee to compete.
18. A valid EC Horse Recording with paid EC Annual Horse Recording Activation Fee for each Canadian owned horse is mandatory to compete in the GOLD competition. Foreign owners or their agents must sign an affidavit verifying the horse entered. Horses without valid Horse Recording and Fee must provide a completed Temporary Horse Registration form and pay the \$45.00 fee.

Bronze (only) Competitors

19. All Bronze Competitors who are not competing in the Gold competition must be current members of Equestrian Canada and must have a Bronze Sport License. All entries must include a photocopy of the owner's and rider's current 2018 EC and HCBC or AEF or USEF membership cards. Non-members must purchase a Bronze license (temporary licenses don't apply for non-members). Please note your horse is not required to have Equestrian Canada identification (Horse Recording).

Parking, Camping and Concession

20. Camping is permitted on the grounds at no charge however, the Show Committee reserves the right to move vehicles to a different location.
Bathrooms/Shower will be available. Please note that there are no hookups available, no exceptions!
21. Trailer and rig parking is permitted in designated trailer parking areas only.
(Please be courteous to riders and refrain from trailering in/out until tests are over. We also ask that you load/unload when tests are over to avoid any disruption to all riders.)
22. The KRC concession will be open Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Entries

23. ENTRIES CLOSE: May 1, 2018 AT 8:00 PM. Entries received after the closing date are subject to a Late Fee of \$35.00 payable on the entry form and may be subject to a waiting list limited to the ride times available. Show management reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason with the returning of all fees paid.
25. Entries will be accepted in the order they are received.
26. No FAX entries accepted.
27. One horse per entry form and copies of applicable membership cards for each horse entered. Copies of cards can be submitted via the entry portal.
28. Entries not including copies of required membership cards will be subject to a **\$35.00** incomplete entry fee
29. All competitors must sign both parts of the waiver and include it with the entry form.
30. Entry Confirmations will be emailed to all competitors providing an email address verifying each entry accepted and confirmed. Please review and advise any corrections immediately.
31. Numbers will not be given to competitors who have outstanding entry deficiencies and/or balances. Competitors are responsible for any outstanding amounts or deficiencies when picking up numbers (e.g. miscalculations, post entry fees and missing photocopies, etc). The Entry Secretary will attempt to contact any competitor with outstanding issues prior to the start of the show.
32. Each change to an entry after the closing date will be charged a \$10.00 fee.
33. Please print clearly and provide an email address on entry form. Illegible entries will not be accepted.
34. The Show Committee and The Kelowna Riding Club management reserves the right to limit the number of entries and or refuse any entry; split, cancel or

combine and/or adjust classes or awards; to govern all conditions of the show; and to make decisions upon any matters not covered by current Equestrian Canada/FEI rules.

35. Please enclose with the entry form a copy of any test not listed in the prize list.
36. Hors Concours entries are accepted at the full entry fee, but are not eligible for placing, ribbons or awards, and are subject to all EC rules, including possession of Horse Recordings and competitive licenses for the National competition.
37. The Show Schedule will try to accommodate each horse rider combination as best as possible to allow for suitable warm up time for all tests a Rider has entered. A minimum of 30 minutes between start of ride times will be scheduled if and where possible. In cases where this is not feasible in the Ride Schedule, affected Riders will be contacted prior to the show and given the option of accepting the available ride time or being removed from the class and refunded the class fee.
38. Ride time schedules will be emailed to all competitors providing an email address and will also be posted at www.shproductions.ca. Ride Times will also be posted one day prior to each Show Day on the scoreboard.
 39. Ride Times may be rescheduled at any time due to unforeseen conflicts at the Show Manager's discretion. Competitors must check the scoreboard for updated Day sheets on the morning of each Show Day.
40. The Show Office will be open for pick up of numbers on Thursday, **May 17, 2018 between 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm**. The Show Office will also open each morning 45 minutes before the start of the first ride time of each day.

Class Rules

41. Each horse may be ridden in a maximum of **four** classes per day for all levels.
42. Classes will be split into Junior, Amateur and Open or any combination after closing date as entries permit.
43. Only one test may be entered in all Test of Choice classes. Test of Choice classes are placed on total percentages for all tests.
44. Classes may be scheduled at any time on the day listed in the class schedule. Ride times may be changed in the case of any error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show. Current Day Sheets will be posted in the morning daily on the Scoreboard.
45. Junior/Adult Amateur/Open status: Refer to EC Rulebook for requirements. All entries must include a photocopy of current EC card showing rider status as designated by EC (Amateur box must be ticked and Date of Birth printed on card). Entries not including a photocopy of a current EC card will be entered in Open classes-NO EXCEPTIONS.
46. Ties will be broken by the collective marks. Ties remaining after collective marks will stay tied.
47. For all EC competitions, riders wishing to compete in two categories of a division (e.g. Junior/Open or Amateur/Open) will pay two entry fees, but may ride one test; their score will count for both categories. Junior and Amateur categories may not be combined.

Freestyles

48. Music must be in CD ready format. The show committee is not responsible for quality of CD affecting output.
49. Freestyle Riders must provide a CD and completed Riders Profile to the Show Office by 10:00 a.m. Saturday, May 19, 2018.
50. CD must be clearly labeled with the Rider's Name, Competition Number, and track identified for the selected music.
51. Sound Bites available with the announcer after 3:00 pm Thursday. Please schedule in advance.
52. It is the rider's responsibility to pick CD up from the Show Office prior to the close of the show.

Warm-Up

53. Rings will be open until the final harrow on Thursday night, after which the show rings will be closed until first scheduled ride. Warm up will be available in the designated rings only.

Refunds Post Entry

54. Prior to closing date, all fees with the exception of the administration fee will be refunded. 50% of class fees will be refunded with a vet/physician's certificate presented 24 hours prior to the start of the show. In the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds will be issued if the new date proposed does not work with your schedule. Proof of other engagement required. If proof is provided 50% of the show fees will be refunded. All other fees are non-refundable. No fees will be refunded after the start of the show on May 18, 2018.
55. A Late Entry fee of **\$35.00** will be charged for any entries received after the closing date; May 1, 2018. Entries received prior to the closing date, when the competition is full, will be contacted and placed on a waiting list. Wait listed entries will NOT be subject to post entry fees if accepted into the show. If the competitor does not wish to stay on the wait list all fees will be returned. After scheduling Wait listed and Late entries will be accepted by ride times available in the order in which they are received.

Stabling

56. Stabling/tack stalls are available on the Kelowna Riding Club grounds, assigned in an Order of Entry received basis and must be paid in full in advance on the Entry form. Cost for the duration of the show is \$200.00 (non KRC Members) \$190.00(KRC Members) plus GST per stall. Stalls will be available from 1:00 pm Thursday May 17 to Sunday May 20, 2018. Any additional days are \$45.00 (non KRC Members) \$35.00 (KRC Members) plus GST per day and must be paid in advance on the entry form. A mandatory shavings fee of \$25 will be applied to entries using a stall.
57. \$25 stall deposits are required. Deposit will be returned if stall is cleaned out at end of competition.
58. Stall Charts and Stall Cards will be posted in the stabling area at the show.
59. Entries not wishing to stable will be subject to a \$20.00 per day haul in fee.

Walk Trot and Grade 1,2 & 3 Para Tests will be held in a 20 X 40 meter arena. All other tests will be held in 20 X 60 meter arenas.

All fees except drug, dressage levy & temporary licenses are subject to GST.

Divisions

Junior - Open to all riders until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

Amateur - Is for those riders who are no longer juniors and who are not earning remuneration from teaching or training in the horse industry. All persons wishing EC amateur status must pay the appropriate fees, complete and sign the amateur declaration, which is on the sport license application/renewal form, affirming their eligibility.

Open - All competitors, regardless of age and/or amateur/professional status

Prizes

Bronze and Gold Competition - Friday, Saturday & Sunday

CLASS AWARDS

Ribbons are presented to 4th place in all classes. Ribbons and tests may be picked up after the class is completed and the results have been posted on the scoreboard. Prize money will be sent to competitors via e-transfer or cheque after the competition ends. Classes will be divided by Bronze and Gold entry and by category as required and at the discretion of Show Management.

When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:

1st 60% or higher

2nd ... 57% to 59.9%

3rd 54% to 56.9%

4th 51% to 53.9% No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 4th position.

- Freestyle High Score Award

- Junior High Test

- Bronze Overall High Test

- Gold Overall High Test

CHAMPIONSHIPS AND RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Championships and Reserve Championships will be awarded for each Division and Category with 3 or more entries. A final minimum average score of 60% must be obtained to be eligible for Championship. A final minimum average score of 58% must be obtained to be eligible for Reserve Championship. In divisions/categories with less than 3 riders the Show Committee reserves the right to alter or combine the Championships and Reserve Championships presented. When there is more than one judge the final percentage total from the panel to count. Freestyle scores do not count towards Championships.

CHAMPIONSHIP CRITERIA

Walk/Trot through Fourth Level - Riders must compete in a minimum of 4 tests at that level to qualify for Championships

FEI – Riders must compete in a minimum of 3 tests to qualify for Championships.

Walk Trot Championship: The combined total of top 2 percentage technical scores from the designated Championship Classes (C).

Training to Fourth Level: The combined total of top 2 percentage technical scores from

the designated Championship Classes (C), one of which must be the most difficult test of the level (Training – Second: test 3, Third – Fourth: test 3). FEI Combined technical scores Highpoint Award.

Championships and Reserve Championships will be awarded once they are confirmed and posted on the scoreboard. Competitors leaving show grounds prior to posting awards will forfeit all Championship Awards. Competitors leaving grounds may designate another individual to collect Championship Awards on their behalf prior to leaving grounds. Classes will be split into Bronze / Gold Rated Divisions and into Junior and Open or any combination after closing date as the entries warrant.

Any decisions regarding Championship Results not specified herein the Prize List which may result in a decision or ruling will be at the sole discretion of the Show Manager and Show Committee.
